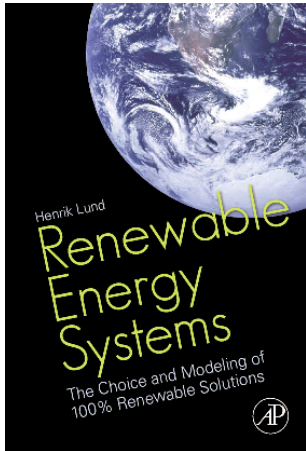

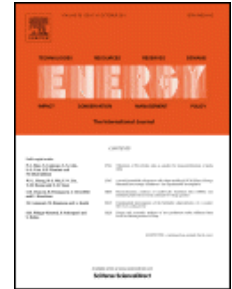
Jutland/Denmark:

- 20% wind power (120,000 owners)
- High share of the world's offshore power
- 30% Distributed Generation
- 50% of electricity supplied by CHP

the international journal



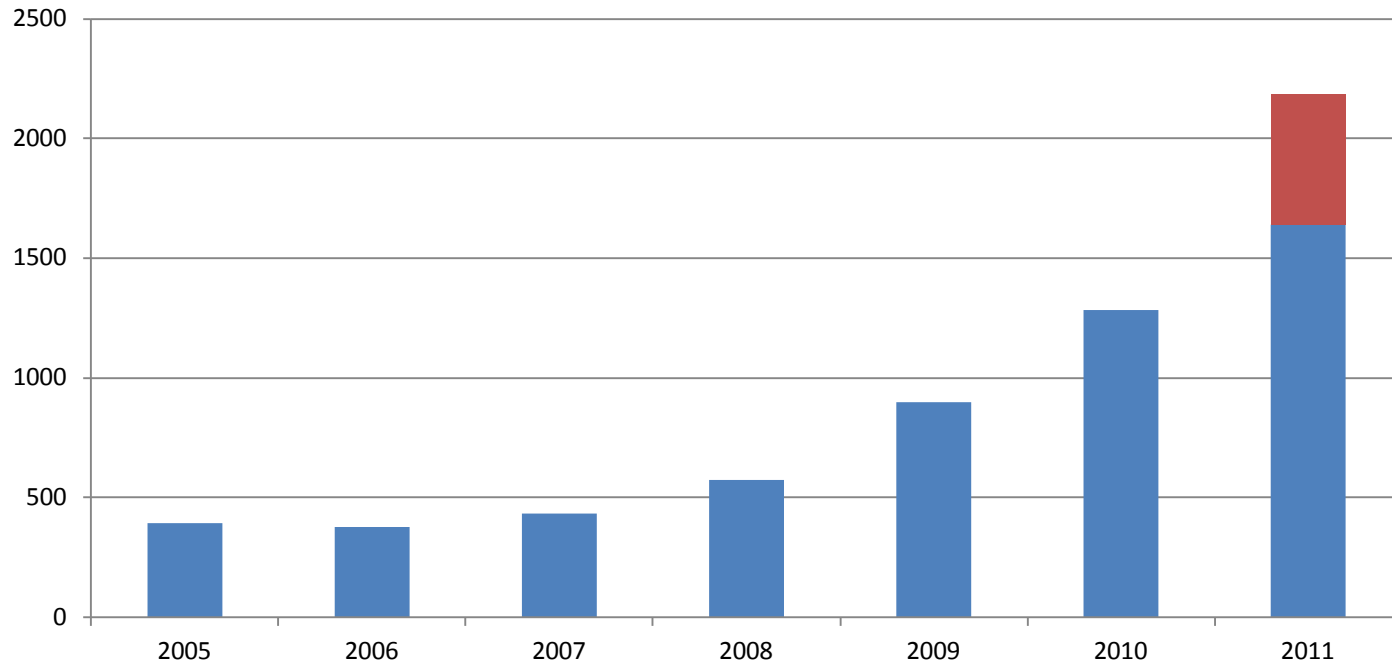
- receives more than 2000 submissions per annum,
- publishing circa 500 papers each year.
- board of 35 active associate editors,
- a panel of app. 4000 highly qualified referees.
- good international reputation with submissions from across the world.
- The different world regions are all well represented in terms of papers published, with authors from circa 80 countries represented in recent years.
- The Impact Factor have increased from 1.712 (2008) to 2.952 (2009) to 3.565 (2010)
- The online downloads from the journal in ScienceDirect have increased from half a million per annum (in 2007) to expected 1 million (2011)
- The journal offers quick editorial turn-around times, recognised by authors in the author feedback surveys



Increasing numbers of submission

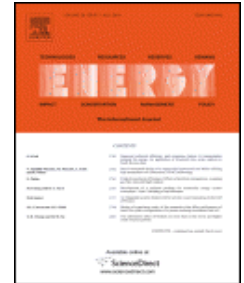


Number of Submissions to ENERGY

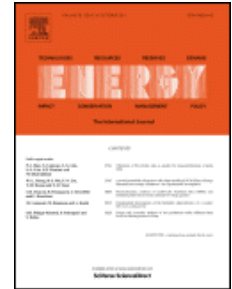

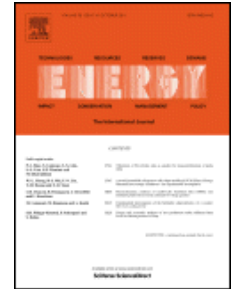
How is a submission treated..?



1. Technical screening
(Journal Manager in San Diego)
2. Language Screening (EiC-office in Aalborg)
3. Assigned 3 reviewers (Editorial assistant)
4. First decision (EiC):
 - Accept as is
 - Minor revision
 - Major revision
 - Major revision (with different reviewers result)
 - Reject



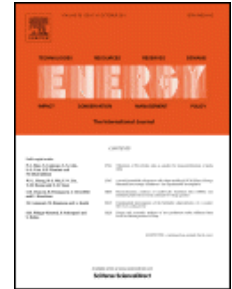
How is a submission treated..?



5. Revision
6. In case of Major revision, new review
7. EiC new decision
8. --- 4-7 repeated until either accept or reject
9. Proof setting (Elsevier)
10. Proof reading (Author)
11. Publication online
12. Publication in journal



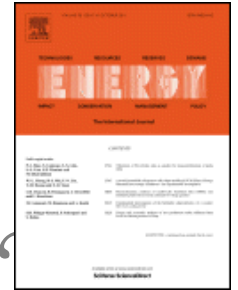
How to write a good paper..!



1. Novelty
2. Novelty

5. Relevance to an international audience
6. Clear scope... (and conclusion)
7. Good English



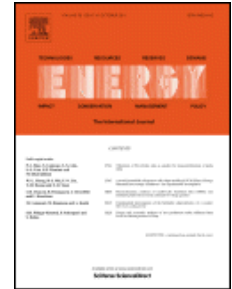
What do you need in order to get your paper published?

The article

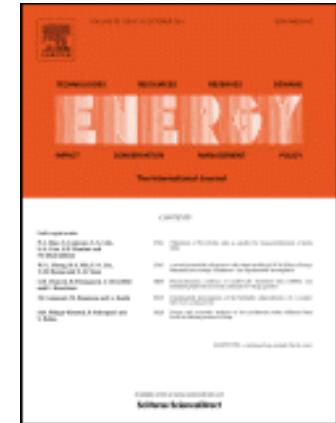
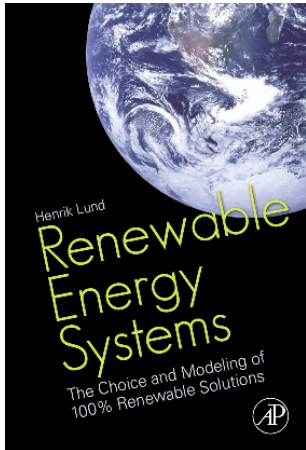
